74	•Address signal light north of School St. on Jericho Rd.

76	Rt. 2 intersection is dangerous for pedestrians with too many moving vehicles from				
77	multiple directions, including the Cumberland Farms parking area. Cars are not yielding				
78	to pedestrians in crosswalk at traffic signal.				
79	•Station police officer in the intersection on school mornings.
